

# SUPPLY KIT: Paper Weavings

I've put together a kit that includes almost all of the materials you'll need to make the projects, which you can purchase from me. My goal is to make this simple for you!

*PLEASE NOTE:* You will find a list of additional supplies that are not included in the kit at the bottom of this page.

## INCLUDED IN THE KIT:

**1. Papers from Washiarts.com (browse their site to find these papers in other colors too). Please note that all papers will be supplied by Washi Arts, but there will be a few variations.**



**2. Plastic Kitchen Cutting Mat** (for cutting windows in your weavings, this is a must!)

- These are thin (1/32") and you need to be able to cut them with scissors to fit your needs:

**4. Skewers** (for the Pamphlet Stitched Booklet & the Woven Paper Lantern)

- I purchase bamboo barbecue skewers at my local grocery store (approx. 1/8" width and 12" length)

## 5. Battery Operated Tea Light (for the Woven Paper Lantern)

### ADDITIONAL SUPPLIES (not included in the kit)

- White Glue/PVA (you'll receive a small bottle that will probably suffice, and it is refillable)
- Double-sided tape (1/4" or 1/2") – I prefer tape in some situations, but you can always use glue
- Blue masking tape or artist's (that releases easily) for holding things in place while working
- Needle & thread for stitching the booklet
- Sticks/dowels for hanging the wall/window hanging
- Small piece of cardboard or foam core to use as a piercing cushion when using an awl

### TOOLS you will need:

- Pencil
- Ruler
- Scissors
- Cutting mat
- Craft knife
- Eraser
- Small glue brush (1/4" children's or artist's paintbrush)
- Tapes
- Awl or needle (for punching holes)
- Sewing needle
- Scrap paper (newsprint, freezer paper, etc)

### Optional but helpful tools:

- Heavy duty scissors for cutting the skewer
- Bone folder
